THE Scots College provides a hall of residence where students of all nationalities may pursue their studies under favourable conditions. It is situated on high ground surrounded by garden and heathland, with wide views over the city to the Mediterranean and towards the mountains. The sunny climate of Montpellier makes it possible to spend much time out of doors all the year round.

The University of Montpellier ranks in France second only to Paris. It has all the ordinary faculties and there are in addition special research Institutes and Stations (*e. g.* *Station Internationale de la flore Géo-Botanique Méditerranéenne et Alpine*, in the very grounds of the Scots College. An "Institut des Etudiants Etrangers", organized by the University provides for foreign students excellent facilities for the study of French language and literature, history, art, regional geography and also excursions in connection with the courses. The University session begins early in November and continues till the end of June, divided into two semesters Nov.-Feb. and March-June. Fees are low and students have much freedom in their choice of classes and courses of study. Intending students

whose knowledge of French is limited are advised to come into residence at the Scots College early in October to be helped with their French ; they can discuss their courses of study with the warden, M. Reclus, and will thus be in a better position to take advantage of the resources of the University when the session opens. In the presence of M. Reclus, of a French lady-housekeeper and of a number of French students, English-speaking students will find ample opportunity for the practice of conversational French.

The aim of the Scots College is not merely to provide a comfortable home for students and to help them to acquire a sound knowledge of French and contact with French culture, but also to supplement the personal work of each and the regular teaching of the University by a more general culture. In the words of its founder " it seeks to harmonize the too dispersive character of modern studies by bringing together the naturalist and the humanist at present too much divided : Science too indifferent to the Humanities and the Humanities or Letters, or Arts as we say in Scotland, insufficiently related to Science ".

Lectures and discussions, dramatic and musical recitals, excursions and regional survey are arranged with the co-operation of students. Such discussions and plays confront the points of views of many different nationalities and different traditions and experience and lead to an intellectual curiosity and interest and deeper understanding of present day problems.

The terms of residence at College for students who come for the full academic year are 850 francs per month, payable in advance. Personal laundry, university fees and excursions are at the charge of the students. When rooms are available, residents are accepted for shorter periods on terms to be arranged.
